January 10, 2009 ARRIVE SIEM REAP

Arrive Siem Reap on Silkair 633 at 3:45PM. You will be met by your guide and transferred to your hotel for check-in.

Siem Reap is the capital city of Siem Reap Province. This small town is the gateway to the Angkor Archeological Park, home to more than 100 temples dating from the 9th to the 13th centuries.

This afternoon you will visit the biggest religious temple in the world; the magnificent Angkor Wat Temple, built by Suryavarman II in early 12th century. Inside the temple the walls are covered by carvings and bas-reliefs depicting Hindu mythology and the wars Suryavarman II made during his reign. Angkor Wat is also well known for the 2000 Aspara dancers decorating the temple. Enjoy sunset over Angkor Wat before returning to your hotel.

Overnight in Siem Reap

January 11, 2009 SIEM REAP (B, L)

After breakfast you are picked up from your hotel for a tour to the City of Angkor Thom, which houses some of Angkor's most famous monuments. You will arrive via the South Gate, an impressive stone gate carved with elephants and 4 giant sandstone faces. Each side has a row of 54 gods or demons holding the sacred Naga snake. From here you enter the city and arrive at the Bayon Temple which lies exactly in the center of the city. The monument is famous for the 54 towers representing the 54 provinces of the then Great Khmer Empire. Each tower has 4 faces. Continue on foot to the Baphuon, the Terrace of the Elephants and the Terrace of the Leper King.

Lunch Viroths Restaurant

In the afternoon explore the temples of the Small Circuit. The most famous among these is Ta Prohm Temple, built in the mid 12th to early 13th centuries. Ta Prohm is unique in that it has been left largely as it was found with overgrown jungle trees and vines and many parts of the temple crumbling to the ground. This makes Ta Prohm one of the most picturesque and memorable of the Angkor temples. Your visit will also include Banteay Kdei, a Buddhist monastery from the late 12th Century, and Srah Srang, also known as the "pool of ablutions". End your visit of Angkor Thom at the twin towers of Chau Say Tevoda and Thommanon.

Overnight in Siem Reap

January 12, 2009 SIEM REAP (B)

Enjoy a half day morning visit to the temples of the Grand Circuit, beginning with the Preah Khan Temple. This temple was built during the same period as Ta Prohm, and originally served both as a religious university and a temple. Continue to Neak Pean, unique because it is not a



temple but a sanctuary placed in the center of an artificial lake and connected to 4 surrounding ponds exactly at Cardinal points. Your final visit will be to the small temple of Ta Som, a Buddhist temple built under Jayavarman VII.

Lunch Champey Restaurant

Drive to the rural outskirts of Siem Reap, about 35km from town, where you will visit Banteay Srei, also known as the Citadel of women. This temple is considered to be the birthplace of Khmer classical style architecture. It is a small temple but its pink sandstone carvings are impressive. You will also visit Banteay Samre, a 12th century temple built by Suryavarman II and decorated with scenes inspired by the Ramayana.

Overnight in Siem Reap.

January 13, 2009 SIEM REAP - DEPARTURE (B)

Your guide will meet you at your hotel and assist with your transfer to the airport for your departing flight.
